Eligible applicants must:

- Be an undergraduate student currently in 3rd or 4th year OR a recent university graduate (within the past two years)
- Be planning to write the September 24, 2016 LSAT for admission to law school in September 2017 or 2018
- Have a cumulative GPA of B+*
- Be a recipient of either the 2015-16 Canada Student Grant for Persons from Low-Income Families or Canada Student Grant for Persons from Middle-Income Families through a provincial government student assistance program, OR otherwise able to provide evidence of low family income from income tax assessments.

* *If a student's cumulative GPA is less than a B+ the student must provide an explanation as to why he or she should still be considered for the program.*

1. Complete ALL SECTIONS of this application
2. Provide supporting documentation. Include scanned copies of the following documents with your application.
 - An up-to-date list of all courses completed with grades for example with an unofficial transcript or print out
 - A copy of the government forms confirming that you are a recipient of either a 2015-16 Canada Student Grant for Persons from Low-Income Families or Canada Student Grant for Persons from Middle-Income Families , OR provide a 2015 tax assessment.
