He carries the name YELKÁTŦE, which was passed to him by his late grandfather Earl Claxton Sr. He is a doctoral candidate at Osgoode Hall Law School, York University, and lives and writes in his home community of Tsawout. His work engages the resurgence of <u>W</u>SÁNEĆ laws and seeks to relate the ways in which those laws reflect and generate out of the values, philosophies, lands, and worldviews of his people. He has taught a field course on the re-emergence of <u>W</u>SÁNEĆ law, jointly with John Borrows, at the University of Victoria's Faculty of Law.
