#### **Submission Guidelines**

## Focus and Scope

Osgoode professors and students actively share their scholarship with the world, producing changes in law and public policy that benefit local and global communities.

### Eligibility

The Osgoode Hall Law School Legal Studies Research Paper Series (OHLS - LSRPS) accepts submissions from the following Osgoode groups:

- Full-time faculty (Osgoode Hall Law School)
- Faculty emeriti (Osgoode Hall Law School)
- Students enrolled in the research stream LLM or PhD in Law programs (Osgoode Hall Law School)

### **Submissions**

To qualify for submission, authors must

- (a) be part of an eligible Osgoode group (see Eligibility, above);
- (b) have produced the paper within the past 12 months from the date of submission; and
- (c) be the copyright holder of their papers or have permission from the publisher to redistribute.

Papers can be submitted using the webform found under 'Research' in MyOsgoode or they can be sent directly to ssrn@osgoode.yorku.ca for review and processing. Manuscripts should be submitted using one of the following document formats: .docx, .doc., or .pdf.

Submissions that do not follow these guidelines may not be published.

Papers published under the SSRN heading of "Osgoode Hall Law School Legal Studies Research Paper Series" are monitored by the Production Editor to ensure that authors are (1) affiliated with Osgoode Hall Law School, and (2) authorized to publish (see Eligibility, above). Papers published without prior authorization from Osgoode Hall Law School and/or which have not been submitted to <a href="mailto:ssrn@osgoode.yorku.ca">ssrn@osgoode.yorku.ca</a> prior to publication to SSRN may be withdrawn from SSRN without notice.

#### **SSRN**

SSRN provides current awareness to new developments in research and is not meant to act as an archive or institutional repository.

A paper must be part of the worldwide scholarly discourse covered by one or more of SSRN's subject area networks to be eligible for inclusion and public display in SSRN's eLibrary. Every submitted paper is reviewed by SSRN staff to ensure that the paper is a part of the scholarly discourse in its subject area. SSRN does not provide peer review for papers in the eLibrary.
